

A Good Deed

I just wanted to drop a note about a good deed people in the community have been talking about today. As you might have heard, on June 22nd, Franklin county was hit by a severe storm, with the Latimer, Coulter area getting the full brunt of 80+mph winds, and 5.5" to 7" of rain (depending where the rain gauge was located). There was widespread basement flooding because of the power being out all night. When Jim Barsness, Latimer and Hampton location manager, arrived in Latimer, after seeing no damage to any of FC's facilities, he contacted city hall to see if he and the rest of the FC employees could do anything to help. He was informed that the church school, church and parsonage were having extreme flooding, and the school basement needed to be cleared to see if the school supplies, etc. could be saved. Jim asked the rest of the employees if they would help, all showed up, even a few from the Hampton location. According to people that told me about it today, they made the difference in salvaging a lot of the equipment and supplies. This really has been a positive show of community support by the FC people.
